Serving at The Banquet

On Wednesday, Oct. 7 our 8th and 9th confirmands and several adults will again be serving about 400 people at The Banquet in Sioux Falls. This is a valuable learning experience for our young people. They will eat with, serve, and get to know others from our community who are a little less fortunate than we are and need a warm place to go and a hot meal.

We need a minimum of 35-40 volunteers to serve the meal, 6-8 volunteers to prepare the meal during the afternoon, and drivers to transport our confirmation students. We will plan to leave the CLC parking lot at 4:30 pm on the 7th and return between 8:30 and 9 pm. Thank you.

Mission of the Month – The Banquet

Our October Mission of the Month is The Banquet in Sioux Falls. The Banquet is a feeding ministry to the poor and disenfranchised of our community and is open to all. We have been providing a meal once or twice yearly for many years through your support. On a Monday morning this past June we served breakfast to approximately 240 people including 20 children. We spent \$220.00 on that meal. Last October we served dinner to approximately 375 people, including 65 children. Our bill for that meal was \$660.00. The needs have only gone up. We are expecting to serve between 450 and 475 people, including at least 100 children, on October 7th when we will once again serve the evening meal. Please be generous. We need your financial support, as well as several cooks to prepare the meal and drivers to drive our young people. Our confirmation students will make up the largest contingency of our serving team but we need adults to help as well. Council Minutes (*unapproved*)

September 9, 2009

The Canton Lutheran Church Council met for their monthly meeting in the Library, Wednesday at 8:00 p.m. Members present: Pres. John Devick, Vice Pres. Tracy Johnson, Secretary Joann Fossum, Treasurer Leon Eich, Pastor Tony Haglund, Pastor Jan Zoss, Janet Henke, Sharon Lunder, Jan Pudenz, Marsha Eliason, Brenda Heggen, Kristin Rath, LeAnn Anderson, Joan Lier, Keith Beachler, Jason VanDenTop, Larry Niebuhr, Julie Braaten, Kari Elling, Mary Toso, and Mark Hennies. The meeting opened with the reading of the Mission Statement. Sharon Lunder led devotions. Last month's minutes were read and approved with the addition to the Deacons minutes that visions money is to be used for the web page. Treasurer's Report: income for the year as of the end of August, \$213,890.76 and expenses \$248,269.54, leaving a deficit of \$34,378.78.

Board of Trustees

September 8, 2009, 7:00 p.m. Present: Keith Beachler, Larry Niebuhr, Jason VanDenTop, Joan Lier, Leon Eich, John Devick and Pastor Jan Zoss. The minutes of the August meeting were reviewed and approved. It was decided to delay paying ELCA-SD Synod until later in the month. City water will stay on through October in East Parsonage. John is spraying for weeds. A motion was made and approved to pay bills. Accounts Cheryl can use only if necessary to increase our cash position are the Building CAP Fund, Parsonage CAP Fund and Undesignated Memorials. Cheryl will move to NET 30/45 when paying bills and she will email bills when complete for the month to Trustees in advance. We are asking all boards to watch spending and to purchase only necessary items. The next Trustee meetings will be after 10:30 a.m. Sunday Services on October 11th and November 8th. The offer to purchase the east parsonage has been extended till October 31, 2009. Leon will work with interested party on criteria for the west parsonage of sale price of \$95,000, down payment of around \$9,000, monthly payment of \$700 and terms of 3 years at 6% interest. Leon will email Keith with developments and Keith will forward to Trustees for an email vote. If this offer is not completed, a motion was made and approved when deemed appropriate to reduce the advertised price from \$109,000 to \$99,000. Over the past month the Trustees have voted 'no' to rent the west parsonage for \$700 a month with a minimum of a 6 month period and 'no' to a contract for deed based on a sale price of \$95,000, down payment of \$5,000, monthly payment of \$700 for 3 years at 6% interest. John reported that the parking lot crack seal is 95% completed. Thank you to all who participated. John reported that Don is

addressing issues of water leaks in the Sacristy and handicap entrance. Keith will contact Don for an update. John presented a "draft" letter that will be brought before the council on September 9th addressing financial information and concerns. A list of cost saving ideas derived from each Trustee and Officer was and will continue to be addressed at future meetings. Submitted by Keith Beachler

A paper vote was taken with 9 votes in favor of the motion and 6 votes against the motion. Motion carried.

Old Business

Pastor Tony reported that the website is being worked on and should be up and running next month. He also reported that Wednesday night services are going well with attendance increase each week. Janet reported that more kids are registered for Wednesday School and there were no problems getting teachers for Wednesdays.

New Business

John Devick submitted a letter to be sent to members of the congregation explaining the financial position of the church and requesting financial support. A motion was made and approved to send the letter and that any money received will go to the general fund unless specified otherwise by the giver. Budget requests will need to be completed by the October meeting.

A letter will be sent to notify members of the special congregational meeting on September 27, 2009 using the language of the petition and stating the date, time and location of the meeting. It was decided to schedule informational meetings possibly on September 20th and 23rd so that everyone can make an informed decision.

John Devick, Mary Toso, LeeAnn Anderson and Brenda Heggen volunteered to be on a committee to organize the forums.
